General (R) Sahibzada Yaqub Khan















Chingiz Garibli, acting Ambassador, Embassy of Azerbaijan in Pakistan said the tragedy of January 20, 1990 is an extremely sad happening in the history of Azerbaijan. On this tragic day the ruthless Soviet army crossed all bounds of civility and killed hundreds of innocent Azeri citizens. He informed the distinguished gathering that Azerbaijan got its independence a year and half after the Black January Tragedy, and his country is now marching towards sustained progress.

Preston University Conspicuous by its Presence at "SOCIAL SCIENCES EXPO 2016"



Mr. Ahsan Iqbal portrayed CPEC as a trans-regional project, which would benefit three billion people of the region through enhanced regional connectivity with Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa provinces of the country to play active role in integrating the whole region. Highlighting the benefits of CPEC, Federal Minister Ahsan Iqbal said it would benefit the most backward areas of the country. The change, he said, has already started to appear in the form of emerging of human settlements on section of the western route from Quetta to Gwadar, which is scheduled to be completed by the end of this year. He said that in the energy component

of CPEC, Sindh is the largest recipient of energy projects, where \$11. 5 billion dollar out of \$35 billion energy portfolio is being constructed in CPEC. The bias towards south in energy projects is due to coal resource. The coal projects, he said can be completed within a timeframe of three years and these would help in alleviating the energy shortage in the country without delay.








Ahsan Iqbal pointed out that CPEC is 15 years-long project and it is expected to be completed in 2030 by focusing on infrastructure development, Gwadar Seaport, Energy and Industrial Cooperation. He said that along with CPEC, TAPI and KASA 1000 MGW regional cooperation project would redefine West Asia. It will turn it into a regional economic block of three billion people, he stated. CPEC, Minister Ahsan said, has translated the decades-old political relations between China and Pakistan into strong economic ties.

Earlier, in his welcome address Dr. Abdul Basit, Chancellor Preston University said Pak-China friendship is higher than the Himalayas and deeper than the oceans. The historic relations between the two countries stands testimony to the fact that both these nations are always prepared to stand by each other in the hour of need, he stated.
